Dr. Ms. Jivanta Schottli Institute of South Asian Studies National University of Singapore



Dr Jivanta Schottli is Visiting Research Fellow at the Institute of South Asian Studies, National University of Singapore. She holds a PhD, (Summa cum Laude) in Political Science from the South Asia Institute, Heidelberg University in Germany and a Masters in Economic History and BSc in International Relations & History, both from the London School of Economics and Political Science, United Kingdom.

Dr Schottli's current research focuses on India's foreign policy with an emphasis on maritime diplomacy. She has written a number of articles on India's maritime outreach across the Indian Ocean, towards key ocean island states and the major powers, through international institutions, economic diplomacy as well as strategic engagement.

An edited book was published in 2018, titled *Maritime Governance and South Asia. Trade, Security and Sustainable Development in the Indian Ocean* (World Scientific, Singapore), bringing together a number of perspectives on contemporary maritime governance in South Asia from practitioners, policy-makers and academics around the world.

Jivanta Schottli has also worked on India's domestic politics, having published a book on *Strategy and Vision in Politics. Jawaharlal Nehru's Policy Choices and the Designing of Political Institutions*. (Routledge, London 2012) and "India's 2014 General Elections: a critical realignment in Indian politics?" in *Asian Survey*, 2016. She is co-authoring a forthcoming book on *Statecraft and Foreign Policy in India* (Nomos, Baden-Baden).
